Workshop: Helping without Harming in Church Benevolence
Date: October 3, 2024, 7:00 pm
Location: Clinton CRC
Facilitator: Mark Vanderwees
Target participants: Deacons, church leadership, anyone who has a passion for helping.
Time: This workshop will take about 2.5 hours.
Many churches struggle when faced with requests for financial help. Often the church does not have a clear understanding of how to appropriately respond and react by addressing the 'immediate' need. In many situations, the response might only superficially address the real underlying root causes. This could contribute to greater dependency, where the church might be playing an enabling role rather than an empowering role. This workshop will help the church be better prepared to walk alongside individuals or households, bringing positive and long lasting changes to their lives

and ultimately contributing to them being restored to all that God intends them as image bearers.
